Joseph (The beloved first-born son of Jacob and Rachel).	Christ (Head and Body).	R 5231
Jacob's special love of Joseph which Jacob manifested by giving Joseph the royal robe of favor.	Our Heavenly Father's special love for The Christ. "The Father Himself loveth you." John 16:27	R 3971
Rachel	The Covenant of Sacrifice.	R 5231
Benjamin (Second and last son of Jacob and Rachel. Rachel died after giving birth to Benjamin).	Second and last class (Great Company) produced from the Covenant of Sacrifice.	R 5231
Joseph was envied, persecuted, rejected and sold for silver by his brothers.	Jesus was envied, persecuted, rejected and sold for silver by his Jewish brethren.	R3971
Remorse of Joseph's brothers.	Remorse of the Jews when they realize Jesus is the Messiah.	R 3982
Parts of Joseph's three years in the Egyptian prison.	Parts of three thousand-year days the body of Christ must reside in the prison-house of death.	R 2888
Pharaoh's exaltation of Joseph.	God's exaltation of the Christ	R 5231
Joseph's Egyptian Name "Zaphnath-paaneah" meaning "Deliverer from death by the bread of life."	Our Redeemer, who was the "bread that came down from heaven." John 6:41	R 2888
Joseph's Wife "Asenath" meaning "Favored".	The Bride of Christ.	R 2888
Seven Years of Plenty	The grace of God in Christ laid up in the present time.	R 2075
Seven Years of Famine	Mediatorial Age in which the world will come to the Christ hungering for righteousness.	R 2075
The stored grain. There was no one else to go to for the life giving grain, except Joseph.	Bread of eternal life, obtainable only from the Christ.	R 2075
The Egyptians giving up one thing after another to obtain grain to live.	Mediatorial Age - the world of mankind's full consecration to obtain eternal life.	R 2075
