## Examples of Peacemakers - Table C-1

<b>Joseph</b>	
Strove to resolve conflict first with involving others	Genesis 45:1-4
Disregards ill will, looks at benefit of what God opened	Genesis 45:5; 50:20
<b>Elihu</b>	
Be a listener & wait to speak, encourage dialog	Job 32:11; 35:5
<b>Solomon</b>	
The root of conflict may be jealousy not substance	I Kings 3:16-28
<b>Jonathan</b>	
Have rapport with both sides and represent them (later Saul renege)	I Samuel 19:1-6
<b>Barnabus</b>	
He speaks directly to the apostles about the Paul's faith	Acts 9:26-27
<b>Apostle Paul</b>	
Paul confronts the apostle Peter directly	Gal 2:11-13
<b>Abram</b>	
Compromise or let the other have a choice, if no principle	Gen 13:8-9
