- √ The jury is gathered: Verse 1 & 2 Hear ye O mountains, the Lord's controversy
- √ The key question is asked:

**Verse 3** - God asks, Why are you so sinful my people? Is there something I did?

✓ The facts are stated:

**Verse 4-5** I have been doing nothing but good for my people. Let's recall a few instances.

√ The defend replies: Verse 6-7

How about I make all kinds of gifts and sacrifices to make up for my sins. That is an empty response from God's point of view.

- ✓ God desires a change of heart. **Verse 8** says what is really required.
- ✓ A judgment is then made for the conclusion: Verses 9-16 All the consequences of disobedience are told in detail.
