A TRADITIONAL JEWISH WEDDING

- 1.0 Christian greetings
- 2.0 The Bible characterizes the relationship between Jesus & his body members in many ways.
- Our focus today is that of bride & groom which is one of the most intimate of these relationships.
- 3.0 The Bible makes reference to the bridegroom and bride in several contexts in the OT & NT
- Gen.2:24 (Adam/Eve); Jer. 3:14,1,8 (God/Israel); Jo.3:28,29; (Jesus/Israel)
- Lk.12:22,35,36; 2 Cor. 11:2; Rev.19:7 (Jesus/disciples)
- 4.0 The virgin parable in Matt.25 is based on a traditional Jewish wedding. C191
- Studying the scriptural basis for the tradition enhances our appreciation of our marriage to Jesus
- 5.0 Unlike traditional Gentile weddings, traditional Jewish weddings have 12 steps.
- 5.1 Bridegroom's father selects the bride. Gen. 24:3,4 (Abraham); Matt.22:1,2; Heb.5:4 (God);
- 2 Thes.2:14 (God uses the Gospel); Jo.9:31; Ro.8:29,30 (God calls only the tentatively justified)
- 5.2 Bridgeroom pays the bridge price. Shows her preciousness to her father and to her bridgeroom.
- Gen.29:6,18 (Jacob paid for Leah/Rachel in labor to their father Laban);
- 1 Cor. 6:20; 1 Pet.1:18,19; Eph.5:2; Lk.6:19; Phil.2:8 (Jesus pays for his bride by giving his humanity [ransom] and by proving faithful in all his sacrificial sufferings [sin-offering])
- Phil.2:9; Isa. 61:10; Heb.2:10; 9:24; Psa.45:13 (proofs that Jesus gave his father the bride price)
- 5.3 Bride consents to the marriage proposal. **Gen.24:57,58** (Rebecca: "I will go")
- Matt.22:2,3, 4-8 (Israel as a nation refused their wedding invitation & were cast aside as a bride)
- Matt.22:9,10 (God then sent wedding invitation to Gentiles); Jo.2:2 (disciples invited to a wedding)
- 5.4 Bridegroom and bride enter into a marriage contract.
- Exo.19:5; Deut.28:1-14 (Jehovah vowed to bless and protect his bride-to-be, natural Israel)
- Exo.19:8; 24:3 (natural Israel vowed to be faithful to Jehovah)
- Isa.50:1; Jer.3:8 (God divorced natural Israel because of her unfaithfulness)
- Eph.5:23-25.33 (Jesus agrees to care for & cherish his bride; she agrees to reverence him)
- 5.5 Bridegroom & bride sip from a common cup of wine to mark their joinder/betrothal/engagement
- Matt.26:27 (Jesus & his bride share a common cup of wine to mark their betrothal) \\R3164:3
- Psa.104:15 (communion cup represents sacrificial sufferings, but also includes an element of joy)
- 5.6 Bridegroom gives gifts to his bride in two phases: pre-betrothal and more at betrothal.
- Gen.24:47 (Rebecca receives an earring and two bracelets as part of a marriage proposal)
- Gen.24:53 (Rebecca received a second set of gifts once she accepted the marriage proposal)
- Spiritual Israel's gifts: first, hearing the call; second, truth, holy spirit, full justification, etc
- 5.7 Bride purifies herself ceremonially washes herself from old single life to new betrothed life
- **Psa.45:10** (bride "forgets" her father's house and prepares to be part of her husband's house)
- 1 Thes.4:3 (spiritual Israel is sanctified, set apart)

- Eph.5:26; R4662:6 (spiritual Israel washes herself by the word)
- Col.3:9,10 (spiritual Israel works during the betrothal to put off the old life and put on the new)
- 1 Jo.3:3 (spiritual Israel works to purify themselves to become fit for the wedding)
- 2 Cor 5:15 (no longer live unto ourselves, but unto Jesus)
- Phil.3:13 (forget the things behind)
- 5.8 Bridegroom departs and goes to his father's house to prepare a home for his bride.
- Bridegroom and bride were to become part of and reside in the bridegroom's father's house
- Jo.14:2 (Jesus prepared a place in his father's house of many rooms for his bride)
- Jesus did all the necessary work to make it possible for he & his bride to live in the divine room of his father's mansion house.
- 5.9 Bride beautifies herself (beauty treatments!) to please her bridegroom be desirable to him.
- Esther chapter 2 (Jewess Esther beautified herself to be ready to become Kg. Ahasuerus' gueen)
- **Rev.19:7** (Jesus' bride must spend a lifetime engaging herself in character beauty treatments)
- March 22 manna (Bride must have an eye single unto the pleasement of Jesus)
- Psa.45:13,14 (Bride must become all glorious with beautiful adornments of Christlike character)
- Songs of Solomon 4:1 (doves eyes no peripheral vision singular focus on one thing)
- 5.10 Bridegroom comes to take his bride home
- Songs of Solomon 2:10 (rise up, my love, and come with me)
- Jo.14:3 (Jesus has come; he will receive us individually when our character development is complete)
- 1 Thes.4:17 (when our character development is complete, we will meet the Lord in the air)
- 5.11 Bridegroom and bride enter into the bridal chamber to consummate the marriage.
- **Joel 2:16, Gen.24:67** (Bridegroom and bride consummate their marriage)
- Psa.19:5 (Bridegroom exits the bridal chamber and rejoices)
- Jo.3:29 (once the marriage is consummated, "best man" announces it to the waiting guests)
- Isa. 54:1,2; Gal.4:27; Isa.9:6; 1 Cor 15:21-23 (Isaac & Rebecca get married for one reason produce earthly offspring).

5.12 The wedding feast

- Bridegroom and bride sip wine out of one glass signifying the union is now complete
- Psa.104:15 (the fullness of joy is reached because the marriage is now complete) R3164:3
- Matt.26:29 (Jesus shares a glass of "wine" with his bride once the marriage is consummated)
- Jo.2:9 (second drinking of wine implied in the wedding at Cana attended by Jesus & disciples) (100+ gallons of high-quality wine -- all the wedding guests joined in the joyous celebration)
- **Rev.19:7**,9 (Great company urges rejoicing once the marriage is consummated)

6.0 Summary

- The 12 step traditional Jewish wedding enhances our appreciation of the virgin parable of Matt.25
- These 12 steps also enhance spiritual Israel's marriage process to her bridegroom
- Each step is based on scripture text including portrayals or historical examples in scripture
- Matt.25:13 "Watch therefore, for ye know neither the day nor the hour."
